

SHEPHERD (9-1) vs. INDIANA (Pa.) (9-2)

NCAA II PLAYOFF SECOND ROUND • RAM STADIUM • SHEPHERDSTOWN, WV
SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 24, 2007 • NOON

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W. Va. -- Senior Harlon Hill candidate **Dervon Wallace (Lusby, MD/Calvert)** rushed 27 times for school records of 311 yards and five touchdowns to lead 15th-ranked Shepherd University to a 42-7 win over West Virginia State in WVIAC football action at Ram Stadium on Nov. 3. The win coupled with West Liberty's 27-13 win over University of Charleston gives the Rams an unprecedented fourth consecutive outright WVIAC title.

Shepherd took a 7-0 lead with 9:06 left in the first quarter when Wallace scored on a four-yard run.

Wallace scored on a four-yard jaunt with 1:09 remaining in the first quarter to increase the Ram lead to 14-0.

Wallace dashed 13 yards for a score with 10:32 left in the second quarter to give the Rams a 21-0 advantage.

A 79-yard touchdown run by Wallace with 7:09 left in the second quarter upped the Ram lead to 28-0.

The Rams took a 35-0 lead into halftime when sophomore quarterback **Brett Zirkle (Stuarts Draft, VA/Stuart Draft)** scored on a one-yard run with 32 seconds left in the half.

A 10-yard scoring run by Wallace with 3:32 left in the third quarter set a new Shepherd record for most touchdowns (5) in a game and gave the Rams a 42-7 lead.

Wallace was named **WVIAC Co-Offensive Player of the Week** for his outstanding play. He gained weekly conference honors for the fifth time this season.

West Virginia State quarterback Nick Mullins teamed with tight end Mike Jones on a three-yard scoring play with 38 seconds left in the game as the Yellow Jackets avoided the shutout.

Kevin O'Brien completed 17-of-27 passes for 165 yards to lead State, while Zirkle came off the bench to connect on 5-of-6 passes for 51 yards to pace the Rams.

Brian Mitchell rushed 15 times for 107 yards to lead West Virginia State. Senior running back **Vincent Riggs (Poolesville, MD/ Poolesville)** added 98 yards on 14 carries for the Rams.

The Ram defense was led by sophomore free safety **Layton Hersh (Taneytown, MD/Francis Scott Key)** with a game-high 13 tackles including five solos. Junior linebacker **Walt Gouveia (Ashburn, VA/Broad Run)** added nine tackles, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, while senior cornerback **Dustin Smith (Germantown, MD/Northwest)** and redshirt-freshman **Marlon Hoy (Montgomery Village, MD/Watkins Mill)**, and junior defensive end **Mike Spiegelberg (Silver Spring, MD/Springbrook)** each added seven tackles.

Brandon Truesdale had nine tackles and an interception to pace the Yellow Jacket defense.

A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach **Monte Cater** is now in his 21st season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won 11 WVIAC titles in 21 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and five trips to the NCAA II Playoffs with a pair of back-to-back appearances (1998-99 and 2005-06). Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 230-9 (.962) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 103-6 (.945) record since 1990 and a 109-8 (.932) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 341-75-26 (.800) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 67 of its last 68 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns an 89-3-1 (.962) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 100-7-1 (.930) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 117-93-26 (.550) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 35-21-1 (.622) record since 1990 and a 39-30-1 (.564) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 139-23-2 (.853) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 87-11-1 (.883) and under Cater it is 97-17-1 (.847).

Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 116-16-1 (.875) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 81-11 (.880) in such games and 89-14 (.864) under Cater.

PLAYOFF HISTORY

The Rams have 3-8 record in NAIA and NCAA II Playoff games, with a 1-2 mark at home. The Rams are 2-4 in NCAA II postseason action. Shepherd's all-time results in playoff games:

Indiana (Pa.) (9-2) rallied for a 45-35 win over West Chester last Saturday at West Chester to advance to face Shepherd in second round NCAA Playoff action this Saturday.

Sophomore quarterback **Andrew Krewatch** (6-3, 225) led the Crimson Hawks as he completed 16-of-31 passes for 241 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for another score.

Junior wide receiver **Ken Witter** (6-2, 205) hauled in 10 catches for 135 yards, including a 23-yard touchdown reception.

Redshirt-freshman wide receiver **Mychal Skinner** (6-3, 210) added four grabs for 76 yards, including a four-yard touchdown catch.

Senior running back **Poohbear McNeal** (5-7, 195) led the Crimson Hawk ground game as he rushed 19 times for 80 yards. He scored on touchdown runs of one and two yards.

The IUP offense was a perfect 5-for-5 in scoring opportunities in the red zone.

The Crimson Hawk defense was led by junior linebacker **Terrence Jackson** (6-0, 235). Jackson recorded a game-high 15 tackles with 10 solo stops. He also had three tackles-for-loss and an interception.

Senior defensive back **Shayne Fletcher** (5-11, 190) and senior defensive lineman **Matt Scott** (6-0, 275) each tallied seven tackles. Scott had four tackles-for-loss for minus 14 yards.

Senior defensive back **Corey Sample** (5-9, 195) and sophomore linebacker **James Carson** (6-0, 225) each recorded interceptions.

Senior **Anthony Rodriguez** (5-10, 185) and sophomore **Akwasi Owusu-Ansah** (6-1, 190) led the IUP return game.

Rodriguez had two kickoff returns for 94 yards, including a 79-yarder, while Owusu-Ansah added two kickoff returns for 65 yards with a long return of 57 yards.

Sophomore kicker **Matt McNelis** (6-0, 210) connected on a 33-yard field goal in his only attempt. He is a perfect 9-for-9 in field goals on the year and is 23-of-24 in extra points.
