

### SHEPHERD (10-1) vs. CALIFORNIA (Pa.) (12-0) NCAA II PLAYOFF QUARTERFINALS • ADAMSON STADIUM • CALIFORNIA, PA SATURDAY, DECEMBER 1, 2007 • NOON

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W. Va. -- Backup freshman running back Jimmy Sutch (Hagerstown, MD/St. James) rushed for three touchdowns as Shepherd (10-1) survived a wild 41-34 shootout with Indiana, PA (9-3) in an NCAA Division II second round playoff contest at Ram Stadium.

Sutch rushed 19 times for 117 yards in relief of senior star Devron Wallace (Lusby, MD Calvert), who left in the third quarter due to cramps. Wallace led all rushers with 135 yards also on 19 carries.

IUP received a big afternoon from quarterback Andrew Krewatch, who completed 34 of 49 passes for 378 yards and four touchdowns. Ken Witter was on the receiving end of all four scoring passes. The junior went over the 100-yard mark for a third straight contest with 13 receptions for 176 yards.

Shepherd jumped to a 14-0 lead midway through the second quarter. Wallace accounted for the first quarter's only score with a 70-yard touchdown rush, while Ryan Lavin (Centerville, VA/Westfield) caught a two-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Lazear (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman) with 9:25 left in the second stanza.

Indiana, which reached Shepherd territory without scoring on their first five possessions, marched 84 yards in 8 plays to score on the first Krewatch-to-Witter strike of the day. Matt McNelis' point after failed and Shepherd held a 14-6 lead.

The scoring wasn't over for the first half as each team posted late tallies. A 72-yard kickoff return by Deante Steele (Woodbridge, VA/Potomac) set up a two-yard Wallace plunge and a 20-6 Ram lead at the 2:13 mark.

Garrett Lestochi rumbled in from five yards out with 48 seconds left in the half to cut the Shepherd edge to 20-13 at the break.

A 22-yard Krewatch-to-Witter scoring connection capped off a 64-yard IUP drive to open the second half. Craig Burgess' kick was good and the game was knotted for the first time at 20-each.

Shepherd responded with back-to-back Sutch touchdowns. The freshman went 27 yards on his first carry of the day as Shepherd regained the lead 27-20 with 6:44 left in the third quarter. Sutch danced around the right side from five yards away to make it 34-20 with 11:20 left in the game.

The Crimson Hawks wouldn't go away, cutting the lead to 34-27 on Krewatch's 59-yard bomb down the right sideline to Witter at the 7:28 mark.

Sutch did the honors as he bounced outside for a 20-yard touchdown rush and a 41-27 SU advantage.

One final Krewatch-to-Witter connection ended the scoring with 52 seconds remaining. Shepherd's Bobby Humphries (Frederick, MD/Thomas Johnson) recovered the ensuing onside kick and the Rams ran out the clock to clinch the win.

#### A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach Monte Cater is now in his 21st season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won 11 WVIAC titles in 21 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and five trips to the NCAA II Playoffs with a pair of back-to-back appearances (1998-99 and 2005-06). Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 231-9 (.962) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 104-6 (.945) record since 1990 and a 110-8 (.932) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 341-75-26 (.800) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 67 of its last 68 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns an 89-3-1 (.962) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 100-7-1 (.930) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 118-93-26 (.552) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 36-21-1 (.629) record since 1990 and a 40-30-1 (.570) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 140-23-2 (.854) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 88-11-1 (.885) and under Cater it is 98-17-1 (.840).

### Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 117-16-1 (.876) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 82-11 (.881) in such games and 90-14 (.865) under Cater.

### PLAYOFF HISTORY

The Rams have a 4-8 record in NAIA and NCAA II Playoff games, with a 2-6 mark on the road. The Rams are 3-4 in NCAA II postseason action. Shepherd's all-time results in playoff games:

Sixth-ranked California (Pa.) (12-0) handed Southern Connecticut a 43-7 setback last Saturday at California

Junior running back **Daine Williams** (5-10, 205) led the Vulcan attack as he rushed 35 times for 234 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the rout. Williams also added three receptions for 30 yards.

Redshirt-freshman running back **Windell Brown** (6-0, 200) added nine rushes for 64 yards, including a 47-yard touchdown jaunt.

Senior quarterback **Joe Ruggiero** (6-2, 200) completed 24-of-33 passes for 228 yards and two touchdowns.

Senior wide receiver **Nate Forse** (6-4, 220) had seven catches for 96 yards, including a 31-yard touchdown reception.

Senior wide receiver **Jermaine Moye** (6-3, 215) added five grabs for 39 yards, junior wide receiver **Perry Ivery** (5-10, 175) had four catches for 36 yards, while junior wide receiver **Joe Slappy** (6-3, 195) recorded four receptions for 23 yards and a touchdown.

The Vulcan offense was 6-of-7 in scoring opportunities in the red zone.

The Cal defense was led by senior linebacker **Josh Zunic** (6-2, 210). Zunic recorded a team-high nine tackles with four solos.

Senior linebacker **Brian Mohr** (6-1, 230) added eight tackles with three solo stops and a pair of sacks, while junior defensive lineman **Willie Walker** (6-3, 280) contributed seven tackles with three solos.

Sophomore defensive lineman **Mark Malloy** (6-3, 275) had the team's only interception with a 29-yard return to set up a touchdown.

Sophomore kicker **Tyler Lorenz** (5-11, 175) connected on all three of his field goal attempts. Lorenz nailed field goals of 24, 43, and 22-yards.
