

SHEPHERD (2-0) vs. GLENVILLE STATE (1-2)

IKE & SUE MORRIS STADIUM • GLENVILLE WV

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Senior running back **Dervon Wallace** (Lusby, MD/Calvert) rushed 28 times for 142 yards and junior quarterback **Tyler Lazear** (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman) completed 15-of-21 passes for 148 yards and three touchdowns to lead ninth-ranked Shepherd University to a 19-14 win over Shippensburg University in the Great Valley Classic in football action at Ram Stadium.

Shepherd took a 7-0 lead with 9:52 left in the first quarter when Lazear teamed with junior wide receiver **John Sheehan** (Round Hill, VA/Loudoun Valley) on a 23-yard scoring pass. Junior kicker **Bryan Beverage** (Romney, WV/Hampshire) added the extra point.

The Red Raiders tied the game at 7-7 with 2:52 left in the half when Chris Lynch rambled eight yards for a score and Jamie Reder added the extra point.

Shippensburg took a 14-7 lead with 11:29 left in the third quarter on another eight-yard touchdown jaunt by Lynch.

Lazear connected with redshirt-freshman fullback **Bobby Humphries** (Frederick, MD/Thomas Johnson) with 12:02 left in the fourth quarter on a 13-yard scoring play to get the Rams to within a point at 14-13. Beverage's extra point attempt was blocked.

After a 20-yard punt return by junior **Taros Harris** (Chesapeake Beach, MD/Calvert) gave the Rams possession at the Shippensburg 46-yard line, the Rams wasted little time in scoring what would turn out to be the game-winning score.

Lazear teamed with senior wide receiver **Mark Springirth** (Germantown, MD/Watkins Mill) on a 25-yard scoring strike with 1:48 remaining to cap a three-play drive and give the Rams a 19-14 advantage. A two-point rushing attempt by junior wide receiver **Craig Tremel** (Lilly, PA/Penn Cambria) was stopped.

The Red Raiders had a pair of possessions in the game's final moments, but were unable to move past the Shepherd 49-yard line.

Gabe Maiocco completed 13-of-31 passes for 178 yards for Shippensburg.

Lynch led the Red Raider ground game with 95 yards on 15 carries.

Howard Chavous led the Shippensburg receivers with five receptions for 99 yards.

Senior outside linebacker **Joey Hooks** (Montgomery Village, MD/Watkins Mill), junior inside linebacker **Walt Gouveia** (Ashburn, VA/Broad Run), and sophomore free safety **Layton Hersh** (Taneytown, MD/Francis Scott Key) led the Ram defense with 11 tackles each. Bill Morrison had 10 tackles to pace Shippensburg.

Freshman **Zach Beach** (Clarksburg, MD/Urba) performed well in his debut as the Ram punter. Beach punted six times for a 36.6 average with three punts inside the 20-yard line.

A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach **Monte Cater** is now in his 21st season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won 10 WVIAC titles in 20 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and four trips to the NCAA II Playoffs with a pair of back-to-back appearances (1998-99 and 2005-06). Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 223-9 (.961) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 96-6 (.941) record since 1990 and a 102-8 (.927) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 337-75-26 (.799) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 63 of its last 64 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns an 85-3-1 (.961) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 96-7-1 (.927) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 117-93-26 (.550) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 35-21-1 (.622) record since 1990 and a 39-30-1 (.564) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 132-22-2 (.852) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 80-10-1 (.884) and under Cater it is 90-16-1 (.845).

Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 113-16-1 (.873) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 78-11 (.876) in such games and 86-14 (.860) under Cater.

Junior quarterback **Tyler Lazear** completed 15-of-21 passes for 148 yards and tied a career-high with three touchdown passes in the win over Shippensburg.

KICKING BY COMMITTEE

The Ram kicking duties are being handled by committee this season. Junior **Bryan Beverage** is handling the extra point and field goal duties, freshman **David Canada** does the kickoff duties, while freshman **Zach Beach** handles the punting.

Senior **Mark Springirth** led the Ram receivers with three receptions for 21 yards against Shippensburg, including a game-winning 25-yard touchdown grab. The Pioneers opened the season with an impressive 29-19 win over Bowie State. Glenville State has dropped its last two contests to a pair of ranked opponents in California (Pa.) (34-14) and Tiffin (34-13).

The Pioneer running game is led by junior running back **Jerry Seymour** (5-7, 175) and sophomore running back **Jared Dearing** (5-10-200).

Seymour has rushed 78 times for 342 yards and four touchdowns this year, while Dearing has added 22 carries for 128 yards and a pair of scores.

Senior **Dwayne Thompson** (6-4, 195) has taken over the quarterbacking duties. Thompson has completed 25-of-45 passes for 207 yards through three games.

Seymour (7 catches for 25 yards), sophomore wide receiver **Jason Burton** (6-2, 180) (5 catches for 75 yards), and junior wide receiver **Brian Miles** (5-10, 175) (5 catches for 29 yards) lead the receiving corps.

Senior linebacker **Jacob Lilly** (6-1, 210), junior strong safety **Randy Dobie** (5-11, 185), junior linebacker **Ryan Jannak** (6-0, 210), and senior defensive end **Michael Harden** (6-3, 230) lead the Pioneer defense.

Lilly tops the team with 24 tackles, while Dobie and Jannak have recorded 19 each. Harden adds 17 stops, and has posted team highs of 4.5 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks.

Sophomore cornerback **AD Hale** (6-2, 180) leads the secondary with 10 tackles, three pass breakups, and interception.

Junior kicker **Alex Amick** (6-0, 170) has connected on his only field goal attempt (39 yards) and is 5-of-8 in extra point attempts.

Freshman punter **Dustan Fox** (6-3, 245) has punted 23 times for a 34.9 average. He has had three downed inside the 20-yard line and three fair catches.

Seymour leads the Pioneer return game with four kickoff returns for a 25.2 average.
