SHEPHERD (3-1, 1-1) vs. SETON HILL (1-2, 1-0) RAM STADIUM • SHEPHERDSTOWN, WV SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2007 • 1 P.M.

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Senior running back **Dervon Wallace** (Lusby, MD/ Calvert) rushed 32 times for 131 yards and three touchdowns to lead 21st-ranked Shepherd University to a 31-10 win over Fairmont State University in WVIAC football action at Duvall-Rosier Field last Saturday.

Shepherd took a 6-0 lead with 5:41 left in the first quarter when Wallace scored on a one-yard plunge. The extra point by freshman kicker **David Canada** (Frederick, MD/Frederick) was unsuccessful.

Alex Ashley nailed a 38-yard field goal for the Falcons with 9:44 left in the second quarter to cut the Shepherd lead to 6-3.

The Rams took a 13-3 advantage in to halftime when Wallace scored on an eight-yard scamper with 2:11 left in the half. Junior **Bryan Beverage** (Romney, WV/Hampshire) added the extra point.

Shepherd extended its lead to 15-3 when an errant snap on a Fairmont punt was recovered in the end zone by Falcon punter Ben Landis for a safety with 13:54 left in the third quarter.

Wallace scored on a two-yard run with 2:56 remaining in the third quarter to give the Rams a 22-3 lead.

Sophomore **Layton Hersh** (Taneytown, MD/Francis Scott Key) blocked a Landis punt and Landis recovered in the end zone for a safety to extend the Ram lead to 24-3 with 12:21 left in the fourth quarter.

Derek Taylor teamed with Stephon Johnson on a three-yard scoring pass with 2:21 left in the game to cut the lead to 24-10.

Senior outside linebacker **Joey Hooks** (Montgomery Village, MD/Watkins Mill) picked off a Taylor pass and raced 25 yards for a score with 55 seconds remaining in the game to complete the scoring.

Junior quarterback **Tyler Lazear** (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman) completed 12-of-21 passes for 105 yards. Derek Taylor was 11-of-25 for 117 yards with three interceptions for the Falcons.

The Shepherd defense was led by junior linebacker **Louis Corum** (Manassas, VA/Westfield) with six tackles, including five solo stops.

Redshirt-freshman linebacker **Brian Taylor** (Elkridge, MD/Long Reach) and junior defensive lineman **Frank Herrera** (Burke, VA/Robinson) each added five tackles. Herrera also had three tackles-for-loss and a 13-yard interception return.

Freshman **Zach Beach** (Clarksburg, MD/Urbana) punted five times for a 33.4 average with three inside the 20-yard line.

Freshman **Deante Steele** (Woodbridge, VA/Potomac) gave the Shepherd return game a boost with four kickoff returns for 87 yards and a punt return for 36 yards.

A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach **Monte Cater** is now in his 21st season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won 10 WVIAC titles in 20 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and four trips to the NCAA II Playoffs with a pair of back-to-back appearances (1998-99 and 2005-06). If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 224-9 (.961) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 97-6 (.942) record since 1990 and a 103-8 (.928) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 338-75-26 (.799) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 64 of its last 65 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns an 86-3-1 (.961) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 97-7-1 (.928) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 117-93-26 (.550) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 35-21-1 (.622) record since 1990 and a 39-30-1 (.564) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 133-23-2 (.848) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 81-11-1 (.876) and under Cater it is 91-17-1 (.839).

Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 114-16-1 (.874) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 79-11 (.877) in such games and 87-14 (.861) under Cater.

Seton Hill (1-2, 1-0) comes into today's contest fresh off a 34-27 overtime win over WVIAC foe Glenville State last Saturday.

The Griffins recorded several firsts in the game. They were victorious in their first WVIAC game and first overtime contest.

Sophomore running back **Antwarn Jones** (5-7, 165) rushed 26 times for a school record 227 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Griffins to the upset win. His standout effort earned him **WVIAC Offensive Player of the Week** honors.

Jones scored on runs of one, 14, and 55 yards.

Sophomore quarterback **Matt Dowdell** (6-1, 205) completed 12-of-24 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner on a 25-yard scoring strike to junior wide receiver **Calvin Stephens** (6-3, 180) in overtime.

Junior wide receiver **Derek Thompson** (6-1, 185) led the Griffin receiving corps with six receptions for 91 yards with a six-yard touchdown grab.

Junior wide receiver **Tony Mitchell** (5-9, 170) added two catches for 33 yards.

The Griffin offense amassed 391 yards of total offense and rushed for 214 yards. Seton Hill was a perfect 3-for-3 in red zone scoring opportunities in the contest.

Senior linebacker **Zack Talkovic** (6-0, 225) paced the Seton Hill defense with a game-high 14 tackles, including 10 solos.

Junior defensive back **Andrew DeMase** (6-2, 195) contributed 11 tackles, while sophomore linebacker **Rob Ellis** (5-11, 210) added nine.

Leading the Griffin secondary was junior defensive back **Matt Johnson** (5-10, 180). Johnson had eight tackles and a pair of interceptions.

Junior punter **Shane Jackson** (5-11, 195) punted six times for a 31.2 average. He had three inside the 20-yard line.

Sophomore **Samuel Tranks** (5-11, 185) led the return game with three kickoff returns for 101 yards and a pair of punt returns for nine yards.

Junior kicker **Roy L Wilkins** (6-0, 210) was successful on 4-of-5 extra point attempts.
