

SHEPHERD (4-1, 2-1) vs. CHARLESTON (5-1, 3-0)

**RAM STADIUM • SHEPHERDSTOWN, WV
SATURDAY, OCTOBER 6, 2007 • 1 P.M.**

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Senior running back **Dervon Wallace (Lusby, MD/Calvert)** rushed 28 times for 148 yards and a touchdown to help lead 22nd-ranked Shepherd University to a 44-6 win over Seton Hill University in WVIAC football action at Ram Stadium last Saturday.

Wallace earned **WVIAC Co-Offensive Player of the Week** honors for his stellar play.

Shepherd took a 7-0 lead with 13:58 left in the first quarter when Wallace scored on a two-yard plunge. The score was setup by an interception by junior linebacker **Louis Corum (Manassas, VA/Westfield)**.

Seton Hill answered back at the 14:46 mark of the second quarter when Matt Dowdell teamed with Samuel Tranks on a 17-yard scoring strike. After a mishandled snap, a two-point pass attempt fell incomplete as Shepherd held a 7-6 lead.

Minutes later redshirt-freshman **Bobby Humphries (Frederick, MD/Thomas Johnson)** scored on a one-yard run to up the lead to 14-6.

The Rams added a pair of touchdowns late in the half to take a 28-6 lead into intermission.

Junior quarterback **Tyler Lazear (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman)** teamed with redshirt-freshman wide receiver **Raymond Mends (Leesburg, VA/Park View)** on a 37-yard scoring play and later scored on a one-yard sneak.

Junior kicker **Bryan Beverage (Romney, WV/Hampshire)** drilled a 19-yard field goal with 10:23 left in the third quarter to up the Ram lead to 31-6.

Senior defensive back **Jerome Quinata (Woodbridge, VA/C.D. Hylton)** picked off a Dowdell pass and scampered 89 yards with 7:41 left in the third quarter for a score to give the Rams a 37-6 advantage.

Shepherd completed the scoring with 4:45 left in the fourth quarter when sophomore quarterback **Brett Zirkle (Stuarts Draft, VA/Stuarts Draft)** connected on a nine-yard scoring strike with freshman wide receiver **Nikkolai Norrell (Richmond, VA/Hermitage)**.

Lazear completed 14-of-23 passes for 194 yards for the Rams, while Zirkle was 5-of-7 for 47 yards.

Dowdell was 11-of-29 for 121 yards with four interceptions for the Griffins.

Jeff Jones rushed seven times for 56 yards and Antwarn Jones added eight carries for 47 yards.

Junior defensive back **Dustin Smith (Germantown, MD/Northwest)** and Corum led the Rams with six tackles each. Senior outside linebacker **Joey Hooks (Montgomery Village, MD/Watkins Mill)** and junior defensive back **Taros Harris (Chesapeake Beach, MD/Calvert)** also recorded interceptions for the Rams.

A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach **Monte Cater** is now in his 21st season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won 10 WVIAC titles in 20 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and four trips to the NCAA II Playoffs with a pair of back-to-back appearances (1998-99 and 2005-06). If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 225-9 (.961) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 98-6 (.942) record since 1990 and a 104-8 (.928) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 339-75-26 (.800) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 65 of its last 66 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns an 87-3-1 (.961) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 98-7-1 (.929) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 117-93-26 (.550) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 35-21-1 (.622) record since 1990 and a 39-30-1 (.564) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 134-23-2 (.849) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 82-11-1 (.877) and under Cater it is 92-17-1 (.840).

Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 114-16-1 (.874) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 79-11 (.877) in such games and 87-14 (.861) under Cater.

Charleston (5-1, 3-0) is coming off a 40-7 rout of Concord University at home last Saturday. Redshirt-freshman quarterback **DeRante Hunter** (5-9, 175) led the Golden Eagles as he completed 5-of-9 passes for 42 yards and rushed 12 times for 95 yards.

Freshman running back **Taylor Jovicic** (5-11,200) led the Charleston ground games with 16 carries for 99 yards and a touchdown.

The Golden Eagles amassed 343 rushing yards with senior running back **Rusty Taylor** (5-6, 170) rushed twice for 63 yards and freshman running back **Nick Lockhart** (5-9,190) added 41 yards on 20 carries.

Lockhart and junior wide receiver **Terrance Spencer** (6-1, 175) each had two receptions for 13 yards to lead the Golden Eagle receivers.

The UC offense was a perfect 6-for-6 in red zone scoring opportunities.

The Charleston defense was led by junior defensive lineman **T.L. Asbury** (6-5, 245).

Asbury, who was named **WVIAC Defensive Player of the Week**, played a key role as Charleston limited Concord to only 173 yards of total offense, including a negative-five rushing yards in the contest. Asbury recorded seven tackles and added his league-leading 15th tackle-for-loss.

Sophomore **Joey Lindamood** (6-1, 215) added six tackles and two pass breakups, while freshman defensive back Brandon Pickett (6-0, 195) contributed five stops.

Senior defensive back **Mike Williams** (5-9, 170) returned an interception 67 yards for a touchdown to pace the secondary.

Sophomore defensive back **LeDominique Williams** (6-1, 205) and redshirt-freshman Travis Riffle (5-9, 160) also had interceptions for the Golden Eagles.

Freshman punter **Wes Sherrill** (6-2, 180) punted twice for a 40-yard average. Sherrill was also successful on field goal attempts of 29 and 30 yards.

Sophomore **Aaron Higdon** (5-8, 180) had a pair of punt returns for 15 yards.
