## SHEPHERD (6-3, 5-2 WVIAC) vs. GLENVILLE STATE (6-4, 5-2 WVIAC)

IKE & SUE MORRIS STADIUM • GLENVILLE, WV

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2009 • 8 P.M.

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Sophomore running back **Nate Hoyte (Waldorf, MD/McDonough)** rushed 26 times for 145 yards and three touchdowns to lead Shepherd University to a 55-14 win over West Virginia State in WVIAC football action at Ram Stadium on Oct 24.

Shepherd took a 7-0 lead with 12:50 left in the first quarter when sophomore running back **Tommy Addison (Germantown, MD/Quince Orchard)** scored on a 15-yard jaunt. Sophomore kicker **Eric Dobratz (Woodbridge, VA/Potomac)** added the extra point.

The Yellow Jackets answered back minutes later when Kevin O'Brien teamed with Jermain King on a 15-yard scoring strike to tie the game at 7-7.

The Rams took the lead for good on a six-yard run by Hoyte with 14:25 left in the second quarter.

Dobratz drilled a 30-yard field goal with 5:48 left in the second quarter to extend the Ram lead to 17-7.

Another six-yard scamper to the end zone by Hoyte with 3:01 left in the half upped the Ram lead to 24-7.

West Virginia State cut the lead to 24-14 at the break when O'Brien connected with King on a 21-yard scoring pass with 1:04 left in the half.

Dobratz opened the second half scoring with a 32-yard field goal with 10:44 left in the third quarter.

A seven-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback **Kevin Clancy (Westminster, MD/Westminster)** to freshman tight end **John Frick (Greencastle, PA/Greencastle-Antrim)** and a 15-yard scoring run by junior running back **Jimmy Sutch (Hagerstown, MD/St. James)** in the third quarter increased the Shepherd advantage to 41-14.

The Rams added a pair of scores in the fourth quarter on a 33-yard run by Sutch and a one-yard plunge by Hoyte to complete the scoring.

Clancy completed 12-of-19 passes for 184 yards, while O'Brien was 14-of-19 for 149 yards to pace State.

Senior wide receiver **Nasser Muhammad (Silver Spring, MD/Sidwell Friends)** had three catches for 55 yards to lead the Rams. King had nine grabs for 101 yards for the Yellow Jackets.

Addison had 13 carries for 103 yards for the Rams, while Sutch rushed 10 times for 96 yards. Fabian Payne had six carries for 36 yards to lead State.

Shepherd amassed 558 yards of total offense with 374 coming on the ground. West Virginia State was held to 239 yards of total offense with a scant 38 rushing yards.

### A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

**Head Coach Monte Cater** is now in his 23rd season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won 11 WVIAC titles in 22 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and five trips to the NCAA II Playoffs with playoff appearances (1998-99 and 2005-07). Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

### SHEPHERD'S MAGIC NUMBERS

#### 24

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 240-13 (.948) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 113-10 (.918) record since 1990 and a 119-12 (.908) mark under Cater.

#### 14

The Rams sport a 348-75-26 (.804) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 74 of its last 75 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns a 96-3-1 (.965) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 107-7-1 (.934) under Cater in such games.

#### 7

Shepherd is 120-101-26 (.538) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 38-26-1 (.592) record since 1990 and a 42-35-1(.544) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

#### 150

Another key to victory is the Rams' running game. Shepherd is 149-23-2 (.862) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 98-11-1 (.895) and under Cater it is 108-17-1 (.861).

#### Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 123-18-1 (.869) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 88-13 (.871) in such games and 96-16 (.857) under Cater.

#### ON THIS DATE

The Rams have played 13 games in their history on November 5 with a 7-5-1 overall mark, including a 4-3-1 mark on the road. Shepherd's all-time results on this date:

### MAN OF STEELE

Junior **Deante Steele** is one of the top all-purpose threats in NCAA II. Steele tied an NCAA II career record with 10 kick returns (6 punts, 4 kickoffs) for touchdowns. He also tied an NCAA II single season mark with his sixth runback (three punts, two kickoffs, one interception) for a touchdown this year. Steele (1,446 yards) moved past **Dustin Dudinski** (1,370 yards, 2001-05) as the program's all-time leader in kickoff return yards. He also joined Dudinski as the only players in program history to record 1,000 yards or more in both punt returns and kickoff returns. Steele is noted on various charts below.

The Glenville State Pioneers (6-4, 5-2 WVIAC) are coming off a 14-12 upset win over 19th-ranked University of Charleston on Saturday.

Senior linebacker **Kaleb Lawrence** (6-2, 240), who earned **WVIAC Special Teams Player of the Week** honors, blocked a 39-yard field goal attempt by Charleston's Wes Sherrill on the game's final play to seal the victory for the Pioneers.

Lawrence also recorded a game-high 18 tackles with four solo stops. He also had a pass breakup and a tackle-for-loss.

Junior running back **Brian Harden** (5-10, 210) rushed for a game-high 87 yards on 17 carries.

Senior quarterback **James McCants** (6-0, 200) completed 6-of-20 passes for 105 yards and a score.

His favorite target was junior wide receiver **Xavier Glenn** (5-8, 185). Glenn hauled in five receptions for 101 yards. McCants and Glenn teamed on a 58-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter that proved to be the game-winner.

Senior defensive lineman **Scott Sears** (6-3, 235) garnered **WVIAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week** honors as he recorded seven tackles (three for loss), a fumble recovery, an interception, and a pass breakup.
