

### SHEPHERD (1-0) vs. SHIPPENSBURG (0-0)

SETH GROVE STADIUM • SHIPPENSBURG, PA

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 2006 • 1 P.M.

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Shepherd University rolled up 413 yards of total offense en route to a 28-7 win over Millersville University in season-opening football action at Chryst Field at Biemser Stadium on Saturday.

Shepherd took a 7-0 lead with 5:58 left in the first quarter when senior quarterback **Dan Chlebowski (Greencastle, PA/Greencastle-Antrim)** teamed with senior wide receiver **Rodney Jackson (Severn, MD/Meade)** on a 54-yard scoring strike.

The Ram increased their lead to 14-0 when senior running back **Bryan Wright (Augusta, WV/Hampshire/WVU)** raced 64 yards for a score with 11:58 left in the second quarter.

Millersville cut the lead to 14-7 when **Dan Csencsitz** fired a six-yard scoring pass to **Randall Eggleton** with a minute left in the half.

Shepherd ran its lead to 21-7 when junior running back **Dervon Wallace (Lusby, MD/Calvert/WV State)**, who rushed for a game-high 145 yards on 23 carries, scored on a two-yard plunge with 7:59 left in the third quarter.

Wright, who rushed for 113 yards on 10 carries, added his second score of the day when he burst through the Marauder defense for a 24-yard touchdown romp with 6:28 left in the game.

Wright was named **WVIAC Co-Offensive Player of the Week** for his outstanding effort.

Chlebowski completed 16-of-21 passes for 153 yards, while Csencsitz completed 14-of-34 passes for 156 yards.

Jackson led the Ram receivers with nine receptions for 120 yards. **Omar Sanders** had four catches for 48 yards to lead Millersville.

Junior linebacker **Louis Corum (Manassas, VA/Westfield)** had a game-high 11 tackles with nine solo stops. Corum's effort earned him **WVIAC Defensive Player of the Week** honors and was one of four players selected as **Division II Defensive Players of the Week** by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*.

Senior All-American defensive back **Dan Peters (Cresson, PA/Penn Cambria)** and senior linebacker **Todd Edmondson (Finksburg, MD/Westminster)** each added six tackles. Peters also recorded the game only interception. Sophomore defensive end **Michael Spiegelberg (Silver Spring, MD/ Springbrook)** gave a memorable performance in his first career start. Spiegelberg had four tackles with three for loss and two sacks. He also added a pair of pass breakups.

#### A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach **Monte Cater** is now in his 20th season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won nine WVIAC titles in 19 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and also earned back-to-back trips to the NCAA II Playoffs in 1998 and 1999. The Rams gained their third trip to the NCAA II Playoffs in 2005. Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 216-9 (.960) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 89-6 (.936) record since 1990 and a 95-8 (.922) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 326-75-26 (.794) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 52 of its last 53 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns a 74-3-1 (.955) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 85-7-1 (.919) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 115-92-26 (.540) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 34-20-1 (.618) record since 1990 and a 38-29-1 (.514) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 123-22-2 (.843) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 71-10-1 (.872) and under Cater it is 81-16-1 (.832).

### Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 103-16-1 (.863) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 68-11 (.861) in such games and 76-14 (.844) under Cater.



### THE WRIGHT STUFF

Senior running back **Bryan Wright** rushed for a career-high 113 yards on 10 carries to help lead the Rams past Millersville. He had touch-down runs of 64 (career-long) and 24 yards.

Shippensburg University is coming off a 4-7 year with a 2-4 mark in PSAC West action in 2005. The Red Raiders return 10 starters on offense and nine on defense.

Junior quarterback **Tony Gomez** (6-1, 197) returns after completing 85 of-194 passes for 1,072 yards and seven touchdowns in 2005.

Leading the Red Raider receiving corps is senior halfback **Walter Crump** (5-11, 186) and junior wide receiver **Howard Chavous** (5-8, 167).

Crump hauled in a team-high 37 catches for 361 yards and a touchdown last year. Chavous added 35 receptions for a team-high 517 yards and a pair of scores. Shippensburg will also have the services of senior **Patrick Ferguson** (5-9, 178) who sat out last season after suffering a broken leg in the spring.

Junior fullback **Aaron Dykes** ( 5-11, 237) led the Shippensburg ground game last year with 147 carries for 628 yards and a pair of scores. Crump added 346 yards and two touchdowns on 94 carries.

The Red Raider defense will be led by junior safety **Jonathan Aldridge** (6-0, 180) and senior strong safety **John Sharbaugh** (5-10, 182).

Aldridge had a team-high 97 tackles with 57 solos. Sharbaugh added 90 tackles with 47 solo stops.

The special teams returns standout junior kicker **Jamie Reder** (5-7, 174). Reder set an NCAA II record by connecting on 17-of-18 field goals in 2005. His only miss was blocked.

Freshman **Kyler Ford** (5-11, 180) takes over the punting duties.
