

#5 SHEPHERD (6-0, 3-0) vs. CONCORD (3-4, 3-2)

RAM STADIUM • SHEPHERDSTOWN, WV

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Seventh-ranked Shepherd University survived a scare from the University of Charleston before pulling a away in the fourth quarter for a 17-0 win in WVIAC football action at University of Charleston Stadium last Saturday.

Shepherd took a 3-0 lead with 13:06 left in the fourth quarter on a 36-yard field goal by senior kicker **Ricky Schmitt** (Virginia Beach, VA/Salem).

Shepherd increased its lead to 10-0 at the 11:50 mark when senior All-American safety **Dan Peters** (Cresson, PA/Penn Cambria) returned an interception 26 yards for a touchdown.

Shepherd ran its lead to 17-0 when junior running back **Dervon Wallace** (Lusby, MD/ Calvert/WV State), who rushed for a game-high 143 yards on 20 carries, scored on a 23-yard scamper with 8:05 left in the game.

Senior running back **Bryan Wright** (Augusta, WV/Hampshire/WVU) added 48 yards on nine carries for the Rams.

Senior quarterback **Dan Chlebowski** (Greencastle, PA/Greencastle, PA) completed 16-of-21 passes for 105 yards, while Corey Isner completed 11-of-20 passes for 107 yards for the Golden Eagles.

Josh Culbertson had seven carries for 31 yards to lead the Charleston rushing game.

Wallace also led the Ram receivers with five catches for 26 yards, while sophomore wide receiver **Craig Tremel** (Lilly, PA/Penn Cambria) added four receptions for 33 yards. Terrance Spencer had five catches for 29 yards to lead Charleston.

Shepherd limited Charleston to 182 yards of total offense en route to its fourth shutout effort of the year.

Senior linebacker **Todd Edmondson** (Finksburg, MD/Westminster) led the Rams with 13 tackles. Peters and junior linebacker **Louis Corum** (Manassas, VA/Westfield) each added nine stops. Senior defensive end **Andre Henderson** (Bowie, MD/Eleanor Roosevelt) added eight more. Anthony Smith had 13 tackles to pace Charleston.

Peters was named **WVIAC Defensive Player of the Week** for his outstanding effort. Peters recorded his 24th career interception to move into a tie with Shepherd Hall-of-Famer **Everett Yore** for second place on the Ram all-time interceptions list.

A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

Head Coach Monte Cater is now in his 20th season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won nine WVIAC titles in 19 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and also earned back-to-back trips to the NCAA II Playoffs in 1998 and 1999. The Rams gained their third trip to the NCAA II Playoffs in 2005. Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 217-9 (.960) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 90-6 (.937) record since 1990 and a 96-8 (.923) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 331-75-26 (.796) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 57 of its last 58 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns a 79-3-1 (.957) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 90-7-1 (.923) under Cater in such games.

7

Shepherd is 115-92-26 (.540) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 34-20-1 (.618) record since 1990 and a 38-29-1 (.514) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 126-22-2 (.847) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 74-10-1 (.876) and under Cater it is 84-16-1 (.836).

Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 107-16-1 (.866) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 72-11 (.867) in such games and 80-14 (.851) under Cater.

Concord (3-4, 3-2 WVIAC) is coming off a 22-13 loss to West Virginia State last Saturday. Leading the way for the Mountain Lions was sophomore quarterback **Rusty Coeburn** (6-2, 235). Coeburn completed 10-of-25 passes for 56 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed 11 times for 18 yards.

Junior wide receiver **Dustin Greenwood** (6-2, 195) led the Concord receiving corps with five receptions for 37 yards, including a six-yard scoring grab in the fourth quarter.

Junior tight end **Ron Buskey** (6-6, 265) and sophomore wide receiver **Aaron Hewlett** (5-7, 160) each added a pair of catches.

Senior linebacker **Joseph Spano** (5-10, 210) led the Mountain Lion defense with a team-high 11 tackles, including three solos. He also recorded a tackle-for-loss and a pass breakup.

Junior defensive back **Ola Adams** (6-0, 180), senior linebacker **Chris Leonard** (5-11, 235), senior defensive lineman **Terrance Lee** (6-3, 250), and freshman defensive lineman **Dan Stone** (6-3, 295) each added eight tackles. Lee also recorded a pair of sacks.

The Concord defense limited West Virginia State to only 173 yards of total offense.

Sophomore kicker/punter **Zach Boyd** (6-1, 210) punted eight times for a 36.1 average with a long punt of 50 yards. He paced two inside the 20-yard line.

Hewlett led the Mountain Lion return game with two punt returns for 45 yards. Sophomore defensive back **Joseph Thomas** (5-11, 185) added a 32-yard punt return.

Sophomore linebacker **Mike Anderson** (5-8, 175) returned a pair of kickoffs for 40 yards with a long return of 22 yards.

Thomas also blocked a punt by West Virginia State's Chris Nigro and returned it 12 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. Thomas also recorded a fumble recovery.
