

### #5 SHEPHERD (8-0, 5-0) vs. WEST LIBERTY (7-2, 4-1) RUSSEK FIELD • WEST LIBERTY, WV SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2006 • 1 P.M.

SHEPHERDSTOWN, W.Va. -- Senior quarterback **Dan Chlebowski** (Greencastle, PA/Greencastle-Antrim) completed 15-of-17 passes for 223 yards and three touchdowns to lead fifth-ranked Shepherd University to a 41-0 win over West Virginia Wesleyan in WVIAC football action at Ram Stadium on Saturday.

Shepherd took a 3-0 lead with 11:31 left in the first quarter when senior kicker **Ricky Schmitt** (Virginia Beach, VA/Salem) nailed a 23-yard field goal. The score was set up by an interception by senior outside linebacker **Bobby Jarvis** (Richmond, VA/Hermitage).

The Rams extended their lead to 10-0 when Chlebowski connected with senior wide receiver **Rodney Jackson** (Severn, MD/Meade) on a 29-yard scoring strike.

Chlebowski, who grabbed **WVIAC Offensive Player of the Week** accolades, teamed with senior wide receiver **Chadd Wood** (Monmouth Junction, NJ/Potomac State) with 7:37 left in the second quarter to up the Ram lead to 17-0.

Chlebowski tossed a 24-yard touchdown pass to Jackson with 4:26 left in the half to give the Rams a 24-0 advantage at the break.

Schmitt connected on a career-long 49-yard field goal with 2:02 left in the third quarter to give Shepherd a 27-0 lead.

Junior running back **Dervon Wallace** (Lusby, MD/Calvert), who rushed 17 times for a game-high 94 yards, danced through the Wesleyan defense for a 16-yard touchdown run with 11:56 left in the fourth quarter to increase the lead to 34-0.

The game's final score came with 5:23 left in the contest when sophomore quarterback **Tyler Lazear** (Bethesda, MD/Walt Whitman) teamed with senior running back **Bryan Wright** (Augusta, WV/Hampshire/WVU) on a 14-yard touchdown pass.

Lazear connected on 7-of-12 passes for 78 yards.

Jackson led all receivers with six receptions for 104 yards.

The Shepherd defense limited West Virginia Wesleyan to only 22 yards of total offense, including just five passing yards. The shutout effort was the sixth for the Rams this year -- breaking the single season school mark of five set by the 1922 team.

Senior linebacker **Dante McKoy** (Stafford, VA/North Stafford) led the Rams with seven tackles. Sophomore defensive end **Michael Spiegelberg** (Silver Spring, MD/Springbrook) added four tackles-for-loss and three sacks. Spiegelberg was named **WVIAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week**.

#### A REIGN OF EXCELLENCE

**Head Coach Monte Cater** is now in his 20th season at the helm of the Shepherd football program. The Rams have had a great deal of success since Cater arrived in 1987 as they have won nine WVIAC titles in 19 seasons. In that time the Rams have made two trips to the NAIA Playoffs and also earned back-to-back trips to the NCAA II Playoffs in 1998 and 1999. The Rams gained their third trip to the NCAA II Playoffs in 2005. Below is a list of where Cater ranks on the all-time victories and all-time titles lists in the WVIAC.

If the Rams score 24 or more points, there is a good chance they will come out on top. Shepherd owns a 219-9 (.960) all-time record when reaching the magical 24-point mark. Included in that record is a 92-6 (.938) record since 1990 and a 98-8 (.924) mark under Cater.

The Rams sport a 333-75-26 (.797) all-time record when holding the opposition to 14 points or less. Currently, Shepherd has won 59 of its last 60 games when holding the opposition to 14 or less and owns an 81-3-1 (.958) record since 1990 when turning the trick. Shepherd is 92-7-1 (.934) under Cater in such games.

Shepherd is 115-92-26 (.540) all-time in games decided by seven points or less. Shepherd has a 34-20-1 (.618) record since 1990 and a 38-29-1 (.514) mark under Cater in games decided by seven or less.

150

Another key to victory is the Shepherd running game. Shepherd is 128-22-2 (.848) since 1980 in games that it rushes for 150 or more yards. Since 1990, the record is 76-10-1 (.879) and under Cater it is 86-16-1 (.839).

### Anything Less than 100

Defensively, the Rams will try to contain the running game and force teams to pass. If they hold the opposition to under 100 yards rushing, the odds on a win go up dramatically. Since 1980, the Rams are 109-16-1 (.869) when holding teams to less than 100 yards. Since 1990, Shepherd is 74-11 (.870) in such games and 82-14 (.854) under Cater.

### GETTING HIS KICKS

Senior Ricky Schmitt is one of the premier kicker/punters in NCAA Division II. Schmitt has connected on all 27 extra points this season. He has also punted 29 times for a 42.8 yard average. Schmitt connected on a pair of field goals, including a career-long 49-yarder, and added five extra points in the win over Wesleyan. He moved past Kevin Burkey (221) into first place on the Shepherd all-time kick scoring list with 222 career points. Schmitt also became the school's all-time leader in field goals with 29, surpassing the old mark of 28 set by Rick Kingsbury.

West Liberty (7-2, 4-1 WVIAC) is coming off a 16-13 win at West Virginia State last Saturday. Leading the way for the Hilltoppers was senior quarterback **Jay Gullion** (6-2, 205) completed 19-of-38 passes for 209 yards and a touchdown. Gullion leads the WVIAC in passing yards (231.4 per game), total offense (212.2 per game), and pass efficiency (134.1 rating).

The Hilltopper receiving group was led by senior wide receiver **Renard Stevens** (6-5, 215) and senior wide receiver **Ron Mitchell** (5-10, 190). Stevens, who leads the league in reception per game (6.22), hauled in nine catches for 53 yards, while Mitchell had six receptions for 120 yards, including a game-winning two-yard touchdown reception from Gullion in the fourth quarter.

The West Liberty running game was led by freshman running back **Eddie Hills** (6-0, 185). Hills, who ranks third in the WVIAC in rushing with a 102.4 per game average, rushed 25 times for 65 yards.

Junior defensive back **Jerrell Reeves** (6-1, 215) led the Topper defense with a game-high 12 tackles.

Junior defensive back **J.G. Baynes** (5-10, 190) added seven stops, while senior defensive tackle **David Williams** (6-1, 320) and junior defensive end **Kevin Dixon** (6-1, 230) chipped in with six each.

Junior punter **Will Castelmare** (6-2, 220) punted five times for a 33.4 average with a long punt of 47 yards. He placed two punts inside-the-20.

Junior defensive back **Darren Banks** (5-11, 185) had two kickoff returns for 41 yards with a long return of 22 yards. Banks leads the conference in interceptions with and 0.89 per game average.

Sophomore kicker **Billy Hager** (5-8, 160), who was named **WVIAC Special Teams Player of the Week**, booted field goals of 37, 30, and 29 yards to lift West Liberty to the win.
